REFFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

AMENDS CONSTITUTION: ELIMINATES VOTER TURNOUT REQUIREMENT FOR PASS-ING CERTAIN PROPERTY TAX MEASURES

RESULT OF "YES" VOTE: "Yes" vote eliminates 50 percent voter turnout requirement for passage of certain property tax measures.

RESULT OF "NO" VOTE: "No" vote retains 50 percent voter turnout requirement for passage of certain property tax measures.

SUMMARY: Amends constitution. Ballot Measure 50, passed in 1997, allows passage of certain local property tax measures by majority vote only if: at least 50 percent of registered voters cast ballots; or measure is voted upon in a general election held in an even-numbered year. This measure would eliminate the 50 percent voter turnout requirement for all elections held on or after May 19, 1998. Thus, the measure would permit approval of local property tax measures by majority vote regardless of voter turnout.

ESTIMATE OF FINANCIAL IMPACT: Passage of Measure 53 will result in a direct reduction of annual local government expenditures in Oregon estimated at \$175,000. The estimate is based on the assumption that at least one election occurs annually in each Oregon county requiring an eligibility review of 10 percent of a county's registered voters. Fewer elections or fewer challenged voters would reduce savings. More elections or more challenged voters would increase savings.

02-53 REFFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

CAPTION: PUBLIC SAFETY, HEALTH, AND SERVICE MAINTENANCE FIVE-YEAR SERIAL LEVY

QUESTION: To maintain current services, shall Benton County levy 35 cents per \$1,000 assessed valuation, outside permanent rate beginning in 1998-99?

This measure may cause property taxes to increase more than three percent.

The proposed levy will be in effect for five years.

SUMMARY: This measure may be passed only at an election with at least a 50% voter turnout.

Passage of this levy will allow the county to continue to provide critical services.

Due to limitations imposed by statewide Ballot Measures 47 and 50, if this levy fails the county will be required to reduce current services by approximately \$1.0 million. Two-thirds of the revenue generated from this levy will be used to maintain current services. One-third will be used to create and expand programs that address critical needs identified in recent studies, including:

- -A Criminal Offender Control Program to reduce crimes committed by chronic adult and juvenile offenders;
- -A team of social service and law enforcement specialists to reduce juvenile delinquency and child abuse;
- -Expanded community policing to assist neighborhoods and rural communities in preventing and solving crimes and promoting public safety;

-Expanded alcohol and drug prevention and mental health services.

If the levy is not approved, essential county services will be reduced. Staff reductions will result in fewer services in public safety, public health, land-use planning, parks, and other county departments.

Levy cost estimate is 35 cents per \$1,000 assess value per year. A home with \$150,000 of assessed value would pay an additional \$4.38 per month or \$53 per year as a result of this levy.

This levy, which maintains essential services and adds critical public health and safety services, is estimated to provide \$1.50 million in 1998-1999, \$1.57 million in 1999-2000, \$1.65 million in 2000-2001, \$1.73 million in 2001-2002, and \$1.82 million in 2002-2003.

CAPTION: A MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF THE STANTON PARK PROPERTY

QUESTION: Shall the 2.28-acre Stanton Park property, west of Crystal Lake Drive and east of Viewmont Avenue, be annexed?

SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would annex approximately 2.28 acres (2.0 acres of land with 0.28 acres of county-owned right-of-way for Crystal Lake Drive) to the City of Corvallis. The property to be annexed is west of Crystal Lake Drive and east of Viewmont Avenue, and lies entirely within Benton County. Upon annexation, the property would be zoned RS-6 (Low Density Residential).

CAPTION: A MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF WALNUT BOULEVARD FIRE STATION PROPERTY

QUESTION: Shall the 7.25-acre Walnut Boulevard Fire Station property, west of Walnut Boulevard and south of Walnut Park, be annexed?

SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would annex approximately 7.25 acres (6.7 acres of land with 0.55 acres of county-owned right-of-way for Walnut Boulevard) to the City of Corvallis. The property to be annexed is west of Walnut Boulevard and south of Walnut Park, and lies entirely within Benton County. Upon annexation, the property would be zoned AG-OS, Argriculture - Open Space.

CAPTION: A MEASURE PROPOSING ANNEXATION OF 421 SOUTH 19TH STREET

QUESTION: Shall the property, at 42.1 S. 19th Street, 3.27 acres located east of South 19th and Cedar Streets, be annexed?

SUMMARY: Approval of this measure would annex approximately 3.27 acres of land zoned Low Density Residential to the City of Philomath. The property to be annexed is generally east of South 19th and Cedar Streets. The parcel lies entirely within Benton County. This proposal submitted by School District 171.

MARY'S RIVER ESTATES ROAD DISTRICT

CAPTION: TEN YEAR CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION LEVY FOR MARY'S RIVER ESTATE'S ROADS

QUESTION: Shall the district levy \$30,000 per year for 10 years outside the tax base for capital purposes beginning in 1998-99?

SUMMARY: This measure is designed to raise \$30,000 per year for the district beginning in 1998-99. A total of \$300,000 could be raised over ten years. Assuming an assessed value of \$16,235,792 in 1998-99 the rate will be \$1.8477/\$1000 of assessed value. This rate is an estimate only based on the best information available.

This levy would result in a \$369.56 tax on a \$200,000 home within the district. The existing permanent levy rate of \$2.9457 per \$1,000 will remain unchanged by this measure. Revenue generated by this levy will be used exclusively on capital costs borne while improving the public roads within the Mary's River Estates Road District. The long term goal of this levy is to widen roads to at least 20 feet, provide good drainage and pave the roads.

The tax levy is subject to the limits of section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

A vote of "yes" is to enact the serial levy.
