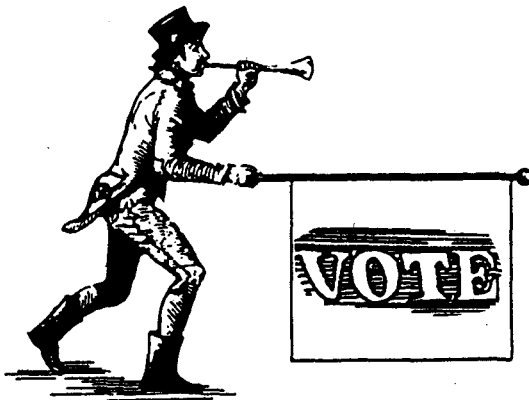

REFERRED TO THE PEOPLE BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY

1. AMENDS OREGON CONSTITUTION: FUTURE FUEL TAXES MAY GO TO POLICE

QUESTION: Shall Oregon's Constitution be amended to allow use of future fuel tax increases, vehicle registration surcharges for policing of roads?

SUMMARY: Amends Oregon Constitution. The Constitution now limits use of motor vehicle fuel taxes and vehicle registration fees to construction and maintenance of public roads and roadside rest areas. This change would allow use of revenues from future fuel tax and registration fee increases for policing of public highways and roadside rest areas. New uses allowed only if taxes or increased fees are dedicated to that purpose. This change would not affect any taxes or fees levied or imposed before January 1, 1993.

CAPTION: GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND AUTHORIZATION

QUESTION: Shall the District be authorized to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,600,000? If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

SUMMARY: This measure, if approved, would authorize the District to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$4,600,000. Bond proceeds would be used to finance, in part, capital construction and improvements which include modification, replacement, repair, and additions to school facilities and the acquisition and installation of equipment, furnishings and materials through 1995-1996 and to pay costs incidental thereto. The bonds would mature over a period not to exceed 4 years. Refunding bonds may also be issued according to law.

**CAPTION: GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND
AUTHORIZATION FOR PHILOMATH RURAL FIRE
PROTECTION DISTRICT**

QUESTION: Shall Philomath Fire District be authorized to contract a general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$295,000. If the bonds are approved, they will be payable from taxes on property or property ownership that are not subject to the limits of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution.

SUMMARY: This measure, if approved, would authorize the district to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$295,000. The bonds will mature serially. The bonds will mature over a period not to exceed five (5) years from the date of issue. The bond funds will be used for construction of a new fire station. The funds will be used for remodeling fire stations. The funds will also be used to purchase fire equipment and renovate fire equipment. The bond funds will be used to develop drafting sites. The funds will be used to pay bond costs.

SUMMARY: The Vineyard Mountain Park & Recreation District levied a one-year tax of \$2665.00 in FY '91-92. The proposed tax base of \$2862.00 is needed to provide for the annual expenses of the district in FY '92-93 and approximately the same level of expenses in subsequent years. These expenses consist of insurance, maintenance, management, and compliance with statutes. There is no paid staff. The tax base is subject to the other governmental purposes limit of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution (Measure 5).

CAPTION: MAYOR TO BE ELECTED BY POPULAR VOTE

QUESTION: Shall Mayor be elected at each biennial general election by popular vote rather than elected from City Council by City Council

SUMMARY: This is a proposal by initiative petition to amend the Adair Village City Charter, Chapter III, Section 9, to change manner in which the position of Mayor is filled. Presently Charter states that elected City Council elects Mayor from the Council at first regular meeting in the year after each biennial general election. If measure passes Mayor would be elected by city-wide popular vote. The Term of Mayor remains two years.

CITY OF CORVALLIS

CAPTION: 02-04 A MEASURE RELATING TO THE PROPOSED BARLEY HILL ANNEXATION

QUESTION: Shall the Barley Hill property, located on south side of Philomath Boulevard, be annexed?

SUMMARY: This measure would annex approximately 10 acres of land to the City of Corvallis. The area is adjacent to the Corvallis city limits and is generally located on the south side of Philomath Boulevard, approximately 1000 feet west of 53rd Street, all within Benton County, Oregon, and all to be designated Low Density Residential upon annexation.

MEASURE 02-05

CAPTION: 02-05 MEASURE FOR A THREE-YEAR PUBLIC TRANSIT LEVY

QUESTION: Shall Corvallis continue to fund transit operations by a 3-year tax levy beginning July 1, 1992?

SUMMARY: This measure continues funding for the Corvallis Transit System. The measure authorizes a serial levy of \$.2061 per \$1,000 assessed value for the City's tax rate each year, for three years beginning 1992-1993. The \$.2061 rate shall not increase during the time of the levy. The levy shall be used for operation, maintenance and capital expenditures for the Corvallis transit system. The estimated amount of money to be raised each year is as follows: 1992-93 estimate \$293,043; 1993-94 estimate \$310,626; 1994-95 estimate \$329,264; for a total of \$932,933. This levy would expire June 30, 1995. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the county assessor at the time of estimate. This tax levy is in excess of the Constitutional 6 percent limitation and in addition to all other levies authorized by Corvallis voters. This tax levy is subject to the limits of Section 11b, Article XI, Oregon Constitution for government purposes.

CAPTION: 02-06 AMENDS CHARTER: PROHIBITS CITY RECOGNIZING OR PROMOTING CERTAIN SEXUAL BEHAVIOFS

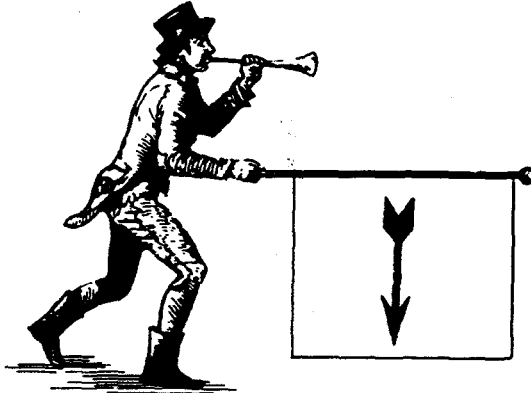
QUESTION: Shall Charter amendment prohibit the City from recognizing or promoting homosexuality, pedophilia, sadism and masochism?

SUMMARY: This measure prohibits the City from recognizing homosexuality, pedophilia, sadism and masochism, under such terms as "sexual orientation", "sexual preference" and similar phrases. This measure prohibits City agencies and departments from taking any action or spending any City money to promote, encourage or facilitate homosexuality, pedophilia, sadism and masochism. This measure does not nullify any civil rights protection based on race, religion, color, sex, marital status, familial status, national origin, age or disability. This measure does not forbid enactment of certain employment laws.
